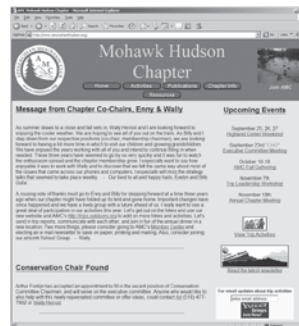

Tuesday, October 20, Sleeping Beauty Mountain, Hogtown, NY B-3-C

This hike will be a moderate stroll to great summit. Saturday, October 24, North Lake and the Escarpment Trail Catskills B-3-B

Tuesday October 27 Mount Greylock, Lanesboro, MA B-3-B

Mt. Greylock is the highest point in MA (3491 ft.), providing great views of northwest MA and part of NY and VT. We will hike via the Cheshire Harbor Trail to the summit. Ascent c2100 ft; distance, 8 miles RT. We will meet at the Walmart parking lot off Route 7 in Brunswick at 9:00 AM. Car mileage will be about 85 miles round-trip. Wednesday, November 11 (Veteran's Day), Sage's Ravine and Bear Mt. B-3-B

Spectacular Sage's Ravine, on the Appalachian Trail in western MA, is a must see, and I come back time after time in different seasons. It is an area of many waterfalls and cascades. Depending on the group's preference, we may also hike up nearby Bear Mt. for its expansive views. Elev. 2,316 ft; ascent c. 750 ft; distance 6 miles RT. Saturday, November 21, Hadley Mt. Fire Tower Adirondacks C-3-B

Sunday, November 22, Mt. Colden AA-3-A

Saturday, December 5, Rooster Comb Mt. Adirondacks B-3-B

We will hike up the new Jim Goodwin Trail from Keene Valley to this peak with a broad

summit ledge and good views. It is the start of the famous Great Range in the High Peaks. With leaves off the trees, there should be vistas for most of the way. Winter clothing and gear should be brought, and the leader can help you decide. A stop at The Mountaineer store will be part of the trip, and likely some pie at the Noonmark Diner. Saturday, December 12, Hopkins Memorial Forest, Williamstown MA 3-C-3

Sunday, December 13, Fifth Peak of Tongue Mt. Adirondacks. B-3-C

This summit has fine views of Lake George and Vermont, and a lean-to for a leisurely lunch (think hot soup!) on top. The trail features beautiful hemlock forests, falls, and glades.
